FOR REFLECTION: “[The] question of authority was a point of contention throughout Jesus’ ministry. He said, ‘I have not spoken on my own authority; but the Father who sent me gave me a command, what I should say and what I should speak’ (John 12:40)...Of course, this was not just a question for first-century scribes and Pharisees. It is the supreme question...today.
