The choir will sing Stanza 1 in the original German, accompanied by guitar. When invited by the conductor, the congregation will join in singing Stanzas 1–4 in English.

WELCOME VISITORS

Thank you for being with us to worship our Savior this evening. If you are a newcomer or a guest, we especially welcome you and hope you will sense God's presence among us. If you do not regularly attend a church, we invite you to come to our Sunday services. We worship at 8 and 11 each Sunday morning, and most Sunday evenings at 6.

The message of Christmas is that God came to earth in the form of a man—Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus grew up not only to become the greatest teacher and miracle worker of all time, but to die a very unique death. In that death he was not the victim of evil men. Jesus willingly gave up his life and died on the cross so that he could pay the penalty for our sins.

The story does not end with Jesus' death—he also rose from the dead and demonstrated that he is God. And the story continues even further when we consciously believe that Jesus died for our sins. When we accept the forgiveness he offers, we receive Jesus' promise of eternal life.

If you would like to know your sins are forgiven, if you would like to be at peace with God, if you would like to have eternal life, tell Jesus you are a sinner and you need his forgiveness. Ask him to come into your life to be your Savior and Lord. Then read the Bible to learn how to live as a Christian, talk to God (and listen) daily in prayer, and get involved in a Bible-teaching church where you can find other followers of Jesus and grow in your Christian faith. We suggest beginning your Bible reading in the Gospel of John.
