A. Sanctification is the work of God's free grace, by which we are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and are enabled more and more to die to sin, and live to righteo@sness.

- 36. Q. What are the benefits that in this life accompany or flow from justification, adoption and sanctification?
 - A. The benefits that in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification are: assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Spirit, increase of grace, and perseverance to the end.

Let Us Love and Sing and Wonder #172

- 1. Let us love and sing and wonder, let us praise the Savior's name! He has hushed the law's loud thunder, he has quenched mount Sinai's flame; he has washed us with his blood, he has brought us nigh to God.

Dr. Dave Kieffer's Call to Reformed Presbyterian Church

Last Sunday, the pastoral search committee of Reformed Presbyterian Church of Ephrata (RPC) recommended Dr. Dave Kieffer to their congregation and he has accepted their offer to be their pastoral candidate. Dr. Kieffer will preach at RPC on Sunday, April 21, 2024, and the congregation, Lord willing, will vote to receive him as their next pastor. If approved, Dr. Kieffer will remain at Westminster through mid-July and begin at RPC in August. Westminster's Session is considering our pastoral needs and will plan to form a search committee for Dr. Kieffer's replacement after his call is confirmed. Please pray for Ephrata RPC (the church has been without a pastor for nearly two years), the Kieffer family, and for the future pastoral needs of Westminster.
