At Home With the Lord

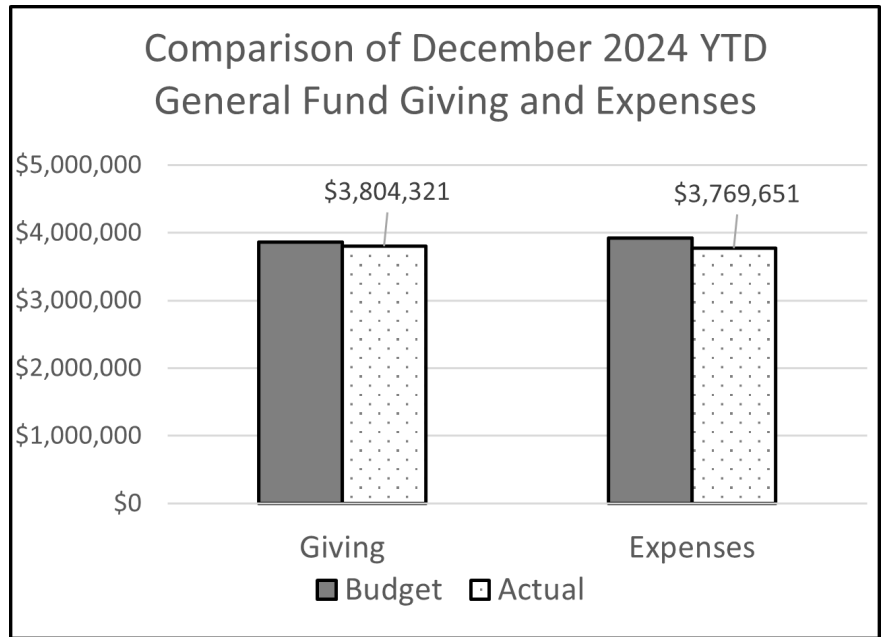
